- The Nonprofit Management Concentration (NPMGC) program's primary mission is to prepare graduate students who are technically proficient, ethical, and competent leaders that help improve the sustainability and effectiveness of local, state, and national nonprofit organizations. Students will complete three core courses. The courses will not be sequenced. However, PPA 5190 Management in Non-Profit Organization is recommended to be taken first when possible.
- 4 Internship (1-3 units)

Graduate students who do not have significant administrative or managerial experience in the public or nonprofit sector will be required to take a public or nonprofit sector internship. See the MPA Program Director for more information.

b Master's Paper (3 units)

(Prerequisite: Advance to candidacy and approval by the MPA Director) Candidates for the MPA degree must complete a culminating activity/capstone course in accordance with Title V of the California Administrative Code. The purpose of this activity is to demonstrate competency acquired in the graduate program. This includes mastery of knowledge in the discipline and in the ability to use theory and method in the preparation of an applied research project. Research for the master's paper that involves data from human subjects must be reviewed and approved by the Institutional Review Board for Human Subjects Research (IRB/HSR).
