<sup>1</sup> Pianists and guitarists are required to enroll in MUS 1200 University Singers or MUS 3200 University Singers, or MUS 2200 Chamber Singers or MUS 4200 Chamber Singers. Music majors are also expected to attend at least three music program concerts each semester as audience members.

<sup>2</sup> Students are required to enroll in studio instruction on the primary instrument during each semester of residence as a Music major, up to eight semesters. Students enrolled in culminating activities that do not involve music performance are exempt from the studio instruction requirement during the culminating activity year. **Note:** All students enrolled in studio instruction must be concurrently enrolled in the appropriate major ensemble.

  - All other instrumentalists complete MUS 1140 and 3 instrumental pedagogy courses outside the family of their primary instrument.
